Frequently Asked Questions About Fair Entries

1. Who can enter items in the Beltrami County Fair?
 Anyone can enter items in the Open Classes. Only 4-H members may enter items in 4-H classes.

2. What is an Open Class?
 Open Class is just that: open for entry by anyone who has created an item or has an animal that meets the class and lot description. The item must be the work of the person entering it. It is not acceptable to enter a gift you received or a purchased item. Animal entries must be owned by the entrant.

3. Is there a fee to enter?
 There is no fee to enter an exhibit in the Open Class areas.

4. How do I enter?
 You or someone you designate must bring the item(s) or animal(s) to the fairgrounds. Come to the Barn or Exhibit area designated for the Department. Intake volunteers will take your entry and put an exhibit ticket on it and give you a claim stub.

5. How do I pre-register?
 Fill out the registration form at the right and mail it in before the Friday preceeding the fair. Your exhibit tags will be printed and waiting for you when you bring in your entry.

6. How do I know what can be entered?
 This Premium Book tells about the fair, the "what's" and "when's". It also contains lists. Lists of Open Classes and 4-H classes. The lists in the Open Class give the classes and lots for entries. If your item or animal fits something that is listed in an Open Class it can be entered. If you have questions about where an item fits or need other information related to exhibits contact the Department Superintendent or area coordinator. If you are entering animals check with the Department Superintendent to see what shots and health certificates may be required. Pre-registration is encouraged for Home Arts and Horticulture exhibits and required for livestock exhibits.

7. What if my item does not fit anything in the lists?
 Most of the classes have a lot called "Not Specified". If your item would go in a class but there is no specific lot that fits it, enter it in the Not Specified lot. Work that does not fit in the classes may be exhibited but will not be judged. The Home Arts Department welcomes such exhibits; if these new exhibits create interest we may add that type item to next year's judged exhibits.

8. Does every entry get a ribbon?
 Kids Area of each class are the only lots in the Open Classes where every entry gets a ribbon. So, if your child is making an entry and you want the child to get a ribbon, make sure to enter the item in a Kids Area lot. All entries in Kids Areas get a participation ribbon. In general Open Class lots, ribbons will only go to the top three exhibits.

9. Do I get money if I win a ribbon?
 Yes. The prize money for a ribbon is called the premium. Premium award amounts for Blue, Red, and White are listed with the lots. There are no monetary awards for purple ribbons or participation ribbons. There are some special

awards from businesses or guilds that award money, gift certificates, or special prizes.

10. When Can I pick up my item?
 The items you enter must remain at the Fair and will be on exhibit until the last day of the Fair. There will be a specific time to pick up entries and premiums won on the last day. Usually it is from 5:00 pm -7:00 pm. Bring the claim stub from each entry ID tag to pick up your items.

Frequently Asked Questions About Judging of Open Class Exhibits

1. Can I watch the judging?
 The Open Class exhibit areas in the Home Arts and Horticulture Departments are closed during judging. To keep the entries anonymous the names are covered on the ID tickets during judging. Only the judge and several helpers complete the judging process and pin ribbons on the winners.

2. Can I help with the judging?
 Possibly. To run the fair takes lots of volunteers. Volunteers are needed to help with judging as well as with other parts of the exhibits. Come to a Fair Board meeting or contact the Department Superintendent if you want to help.

3. Who does the judging?
 The Fair Board looks for people with knowledge and expertise in the areas being judged. The judges may change from year to year. It depends on availability. Judges do not make entries in any areas they judge.

4. What judging system is used?
 The American judging system is used. This judging process ranks exhibits one against another and awards one first place, one second place, and one third place only. Judges may withhold awards in any lot if, in their opinion, no exhibit is worthy. This rarely occurs as most entries are well made. In lots where there are more than three entries some entries will not receive ribbons. Most entries are very good, but only the three top entries receive ribbons.

Beltrami County Fair Dog Policy

No dog shall be allowed on the Beltrami County Fairgrounds premises during fair week unless:

- It is a **bona fide** service dog
- It's presence is authorized by the Fairboard in advance of its attendance and it is leashed or kenneled at all times.
- It's presence is part of an organized and announced Fair activity.

Anyone violating these rules with a dog will remove the dog from the Fairgrounds property immediately upon being asked.

Note: Northern Township leash rules apply during non-fair times.

Please note - There are 2 different classes for entering in the Arrangements category - Novice for those who have received no more than 2 blue ribbons at past Beltrami Co. fairs (in the arrangement category) and Advanced for those who received more than 2 blue ribbons. Check the fair website for a tutorial on flower arranging.

Unless indicated, this department is limited to amateurs. All cut flowers must be grown by the exhibitor and must be in clear glass containers appropriate in size to that of specimen. Only one entry per lot is allowed. **Entries in any category must not include noxious weeds.** Responsibility for entering only the specified number of blooms or stems for each Lot is that of the exhibitor. Pot size will be enforced. Listing variety name on entry is desired in all classes. Any insect infested plants will be rejected.

DISPLAY TIPS:

-Prop specimen in container; narrow necked containers are best for most flowers.

-Foliage under the water line should be removed under the water line and no extra green material is allowed, unless specified.

-Condition the specimen by cutting and placing in warm water to which cut flower conditioner has been added, then place in a dark, cool place.

-Watch for insects and insect damage

-Remove extra buds

-Blooms should be the same size and color

TERMS:

Stem - support for flowers and leaves

Spray - a small branch bearing buds, flowers or berries

Spike - an unbranched stalk full of flowers

Bloom - a single flower (or bud)

Panicle - a branched cluster of stalked flowers

Umbel - a flat topped flower cluster resembling an umbrella
Entries must be submitted between the hours of **12 noon and 7 p.m.** on entry day, Wednesday, and must be picked up at 5 p.m. on the final day of the fair. Please note that Home Arts has different hours - check their premium list for times!! Pre-registration greatly speeds up the entry process. Exhibitors with a large number of exhibits are encouraged to arrive early to avoid congestion. Late entries will not be accepted. All exhibitors are asked to come prepared with written entry information appropriate to category.

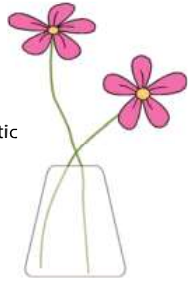

Planters will be judged on quality of plants - vigor, free of disease and insects, cleanliness, number and size of plants proportionate to planter size.

Flowers may be purchased or grown by the exhibitor or gathered from the wild in appropriate categories. The following noxious weeds are prohibited: Poison Ivy, Leafy Spurge, Canada Thistle, Garlic Mustard, Purple Loosestrife, Wild Parsnip, Common Tansy, Narrowleaf Bittercress, Spotted Knapweed, Buckthorn and Multiflora Rose. Artistic arrangement must be the work of the exhibitor with one entry permitted in each class. Choose any design style unless noted. Accessories may be included to highlight entries but should be minimized. All entries should reflect the 2019 theme, "Good Grief Charlie Brown & Other Comics" and should be arranged in the specified design.

Herbs must be fresh, cultivated by the exhibitor and displayed in a glass container proportionate to specimen size. Herbs should be conditioned and displayed with no foliage under the water. See the display tips at the beginning of the flowers and herbs section for specific instructions. Sample must be 3 separate stems unless indicated otherwise below. Include flowers when possible. Take note of the Latin names as some herbs have similar and confusing common names. Samples should be clean and free of insect damage.
