All cattle, swine, sheep and goats need to be tagged with the official Minnesota 41 tags unless they are registered animals that are tattooed and the registration papers accompany the animal.

Pre-Registration:
 All livestock entries must be PRE-REGISTERED with the department Superintendent and the Fair Office no later than one week prior to entry day.

General Requirements:
 The National Code of Show Ring Ethics will be followed. Submission of entry indicates an agreement to abide by all conditions and rules listed within the document:

Livestock and poultry that exhibit symptoms of any infectious or communicable disease, including ringworm and warts, may not be exhibited. All animals must be examined by the official veterinarian on the day they are admitted to the exhibition and at least once daily during the exhibitions. All imported animals must be accompanied by a certificate of veterinary inspection and meet the Board's importation requirements.
SHEEP and GOATS: All sheep and goats, including wethers, must be identified with official identification approved for use in the scrapie eradication program.

SWINE: Swine must be individually identified and must: (1) have had a negative official pseudorabies test conducted within 30 days prior to the opening date of the exhibition or (2) originate directly from a qualified pseudorabies-negative herd; or (3) originate directly from a Stage IV or V county or area. All 50 states are currently pseudorabies Stage V (Pseudorabies Free Status)

HORSES: All horses must be negative to an official test for Equine Infectious anemia (EIA) within 12 months prior to the opening date of the exhibition. A test is not required for suckling foals accompanying a negative dam.

POULTRY: Poultry, except waterfowl and pigeons, must be individually identified with a leg or wing band and accompanied by a form approved by the board to show compliance with one of the following: negative test for pullorum-typhoid disease conducted within 90 days prior to the opening date of the exhibition; originate directly from parent stock tested and found negative for pullorum-typhoid disease within the last 12 months. In addition, turkeys must be tested negative or originate directly from parent stock that is tested negative for Salmonella typhimurium, Mycoplasma gallesepticum, and Mycoplasma synoviae.

DOGS: Dogs over six months of age must be accompanied by a certificate of rabies vaccination issued by a licensed veterinarian.

GENERAL INFORMATION

- All livestock entries must be PRE-REGISTERED with the **Superintendent** and the **Fair Office** no later than one week prior to entry day.
- Pens and stalls will be assigned by the superintendent on a first-come, first served basis, according to pre-registration date.
- Entries accepted Wednesday from noon to 8:00 pm.
- Entries accepted from 9:00 am until noon on Thursday
- Release time is 5:00 pm Sunday.
- Breeding age bulls must be double-tied (ropes and nose rings or nose leads)
- Cattle do not have to be Bangs tested.
- It is understood that all exhibitors will be responsible for all care, feeding, watering, and cleaning of stalls and exhibit while animals remain at the Fair. Limited Straw available
- Animals must be in show condition. All exhibitors must sign the IAFE (International Association of Fairs and Expositions) National Code of Show Ring Ethics.
- Specific barn rules will be posted in the barn.
- Number of exhibits per exhibitor may be limited if space is not available.
- Number of Placings paid to any exhibitor will be limited to two placings in a lot.
- All Beef that are tied are required to also have a neck tie.

National Code of Showing Ethics will be followed.

Barns will be locked at 10:00 pm, open at 7:00 am. See general rules regarding number of exhibits allowed per lot.

BEEF COW-CALF INFORMATION

- 4-H Entrants w/Blue Ribbon @ halter may enter the same animal in open class
- 4-H Pen Cow/Calf cannot compete in open class
- Exhibit to consist of a cow and her single calf
- Calf must be born during current year
- Exhibit will be exhibited unless pens are full
- Intent of entry must be registered with the superintendent by July 15
- Entry day, exhibitor is to furnish the following information to superintendent:
 - Approximate age and breed of cow
 - Breed of sire
 - Birth date of calf
 - 60% of judging score will be based on general quality and growthiness of the calf, 40% on quality and soundness of the cow as an efficient pasture brood animal
