When you head to the fairgrounds this year, you will notice that Northern Township is updating Fairgrounds Road. We are working with them on timing so there will always be one gate open during the summer. We do not anticipate any problems with the road construction interfering with the Fair.

You will also see that there are several changes to the grounds since the last fair. The dog arena has been moved to make room for updates to the new robotics building and there is a new ticket booth at the grandstand to make ticket taking easier for events.

Bingo is back this year but it is not in the Beer Garden, it will be located in Building 14. Also back this year is the Demo Derby on Sunday in the Grandstand.

On the heritage square stage you will see George of the Juggle who will present two interactive programs involving the history of juggling and magic at 4:15pm and 5:30 pm on wednesday night, August 7th. Especially geared to youth this is a fun way to start your Fair experience while waiting for the free concert presented by a local band "Figuring It Out, Abello Acoustics Band" from 6:30 -8:00 pm in the Grandstand.

Beltrami Electric Night at the Fair is back this year hosting an annual meeting at the Shutter Stage and providing coupons for Fair vendor food to members who register.

Heritage Square will also host Tae Kwon Do demonstrations, the Headwaters Science Center for two days, Safe Kid Car seat training, Visit Bemidji, a whole day of Loon Country Arts with various artists, the Headwaters Chapter of Trout Unlimited will be teaching a class on fly tying and how to cast that fly one it's done.

We are looking forward to a great fair this year with great food, lots of new fun events and exhibits. We hope to see you there.

Frequently Asked Questions About Fair Entries

- 1. Who can enter items in the Beltrami County Fair?**
Anyone can enter items in the Open Classes. Only 4-H members may enter items in 4-H classes.
- 2. What is an Open Class?**
Open Class is just that: open for entry by anyone who has created an item or has an animal that meets the class and lot description. The item must be the work of the person entering it. It is not acceptable to enter a gift you received or a purchased item. Animal entries must be owned by the entrant.
- 3. Is there a fee to enter?**
There is no fee to enter an exhibit in the Open Class areas.
- 4. How do I enter?**
You or someone you designate must bring the item(s) or animal(s) to the fairgrounds. Come to the Barn or Exhibit area designated for the Department. Intake volunteers will take your entry and put an exhibit ticket on it and give you a claim stub.
- 5. How do I pre-register?**
Fill out the registration form at the left and mail it in before the Friday preceding the fair. Your exhibit tags will be printed and waiting for you when you bring in your entry.
- 6. How do I know what can be entered?**
This Premium Book tells about the fair, the "what's" and "when's". It also contains lists. Lists of Open Classes and 4-H classes. The lists in the Open Class give the classes and lots for entries. If your item or animal fits something that is listed in an Open Class it can be entered. If you have questions about where an item fits or need other information related to exhibits contact the Department Superintendent or area coordinator. If you are entering animals check with the Department Superintendent to see what shots and health certificates may be required. Pre-registration is encouraged for Home Arts and Horticulture exhibits and required for livestock exhibits.
- 7. What if my item does not fit anything in the lists?**
Most of the classes have a lot called "Not Specified". If your item would go in a class but there is no specific lot that fits it, enter it in the Not Specified lot. Work that does not fit in the classes may be exhibited but will not be judged. The Home Arts Department welcomes such exhibits; if these new exhibits create interest we may add that type item to next year's judged exhibits.
- 8. Does every entry get a ribbon?**
Kids Area of each class are the only lots in the Open Classes where every entry gets a ribbon. So, if your child is making an entry and you want the child to get a ribbon, make sure to enter the item in a Kids Area lot. All entries in Kids Areas get a participation ribbon. In general Open Class lots, ribbons will only go to the top three exhibits.
- 9. Do I get money if I win a ribbon?**
Yes. The prize money for a ribbon is called the premium. Premium award amounts for Blue, Red, and White are listed with the lots. There are no monetary awards for purple ribbons or participation ribbons. There are some special awards from businesses or guilds that award money, gift certificates, or special prizes.
- 10. When Can I pick up my item?**
The items you enter must remain at the Fair and will be on exhibit until the last day of the Fair. There will be a specific time to pick up entries and Placings won on the last day. Usually it is from 5:00 pm -7:00 pm. Bring the claim stub from each entry ID tag to pick up your items.

Frequently Asked Questions About Judging of Open Class Exhibits

- 1. Can I watch the judging?**
The Open Class exhibit areas in the Home Arts and Horticulture Departments are closed during judging. To keep the entries anonymous the names are covered on the ID tickets during judging. Only the judge and several helpers complete the judging process and pin ribbons on the winners.
- 2. Can I help with the judging?**
Possibly. To run the fair takes lots of volunteers. Volunteers are needed to help with judging as well as with other parts of the exhibits. Come to a Fair Board meeting or contact the Department Superintendent if you want to help.
- 3. Who does the judging?**
The Fair Board looks for people with knowledge and expertise in the areas being judged. The judges may change from year to year. It depends on availability. Judges do not make entries in any areas they judge.
- 4. What judging system is used?**
The American judging system is used. This judging process ranks exhibits one against another and awards one first place, one second place, and one third place only. Judges may withhold awards in any lot if, in their opinion, no exhibit is worthy. This rarely occurs as most entries are well made. In lots where there are more than three entries some entries will not receive ribbons. Most entries are very good, but only the three top entries receive ribbons.

Beltrami County Fair Dog Policy

No dog shall be allowed on the Beltrami County Fairgrounds premises during fair week unless:

- It is a **bona fide** service dog
- You have proof of vaccination
- Service dogs and their owners must register at the Fair Office (located in the 4H Building) and obtain a placard to be worn by the owner while attending the Fair. The dog must be on leash (connected to the owner) at all times while attending the Fair.
- It's presence is part of an organized and announced Fair activity.

Anyone violating these rules with a dog will remove the dog from the Fairgrounds property immediately upon being asked.

Note: Northern Township leash rules apply during non-fair times.

- Note: All Quilts must be entered Tuesday evening
- Exhibit Area opens for viewing: 2:00 pm, Thursday of Fair Week.
- Pick up time: 5:00 pm to 6:30 pm Sunday of Fair Week.
- Help Needed:** We need volunteers to assist with pre-fair set up, intake, pick up and monitoring Home Arts during the Fair. Please call the Fair Office (444-8169) or Department Supervisor to let us know how you can help.
- Please note that Horticulture areas have different entry hours - check their list for times.
- Pre-registration greatly speeds up entry time. PRE-REGISTRATION MUST BE POSTMARKED BY FRIDAY BEFORE FAIR WEEK.

Home Arts General Rules

- All articles must be made by the exhibitor and not previously displayed at the Beltrami County Fair.
- Carefully follow instructions as to size, quantity and presentation of exhibits located at the beginning of each section. Questions- call the Supervisor of that Section. We are happy to help.
- Limit of one entry per exhibitor in any lot.**
- When two levels exist, entry can only be made in the advanced lot or the Beginner lot, not in both.
- Bring items for entry to Home Arts area between the hours of 5:00 pm and 8:00 pm on Tuesday, or noon to 4:00 pm on Wednesday of fair week. No mailed items accepted. If someone else brings the items, have an information card attached to each item with class and lot clearly identified.
- All items entered, remain on exhibit until closing time on Sunday afternoon. Claim tickets will be given when the item is entered and must be presented during pick up time to claim your item and award. No early release of items.
- The American judging system is used. This judging system ranks exhibits one against another and awards one first place, one second place, and one third place. The judges may withhold awards in any lot if, in their opinion, no exhibit is worthy.
- Every item in competition must correspond in number and description with the award list and be entered in the proper class. No changes or alterations shall be permitted after entry time is closed.
- Items not in the premium list may be exhibited at the discretion of the Superintendent, but will not be considered for Placings. The Home Arts Department welcomes such exhibits; if the items create interest, we may add it as a new category to next year's judged exhibits.
- All items are entered and show at the risk of the owners. While all reasonable care will be taken in the handling and protection of exhibits, the officials will in no case be responsible for any damage or loss.

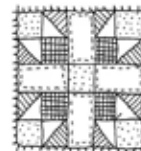

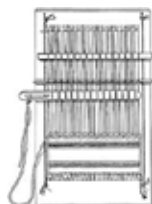

GENERAL INFORMATION

There have been changes, additions, and/or deletions from past years, so it is important to read through the premium list carefully. This area is for home gardeners only – persons who earn a living selling produce are excluded.

All cattle, swine, sheep and goats need to be tagged with the official Minnesota 41 tags unless they are registered animals that are tattooed and the registration papers accompany the animal.

Pre-Registration:
 All livestock entries must be **PRE-REGISTERED** with the department Superintendent and the Fair Office no later than one week prior to entry day.

General Requirements:
 The National Code of Show Ring Ethics will be followed. Submission of entry indicates an agreement to abide by all conditions and rules listed within the document:

 Additional copies are available in the Beltrami Extension Office.

Livestock and poultry that exhibit symptoms of any infectious or communicable disease, including ringworm and warts, may not be exhibited. All animals must be examined by the official veterinarian on the day they are admitted to the exhibition and at least once daily during the exhibitions. All imported animals must be accompanied by a certificate of veterinary inspection and meet the Board's importation requirements. **SHEEP and GOATS:** All sheep and goats, including wethers, must be identified with official identification approved for use in the scrapie eradication program.

SWINE: Swine must be individually identified and must: (1) have had a negative official pseudorabies test conducted within 30 days prior to the opening date of the exhibition or (2) originate directly from a qualified pseudorabies-negative herd; or (3) originate directly from a Stage IV or V county or area. All 50 states are currently pseudorabies Stage V (Pseudorabies Free Status)

HORSES: All horses must be negative to an official test for Equine Infectious anemia (EIA) within 12 months prior to the opening date of the exhibition. A test is not required for suckling foals accompanying a negative dam.

POULTRY: Poultry, except waterfowl and pigeons, must be individually identified with a leg or wing band and accompanied by a form approved by the board to show compliance with one of the following: negative test for pullorum-typhoid disease conducted within 90 days prior to the opening date of the exhibition; originate directly from parent stock tested and found negative for pullorum-typhoid disease within the last 12 months. In addition, turkeys must be tested negative or originate directly from parent stock that is tested negative for Salmonella typhimurium, Mycoplasma gallesepiticum, and Mycoplasma synoviae.

DOGS: Dogs over six months of age must be accompanied by a certificate of rabies vaccination issued by a licensed veterinarian.



The Minnesota Department of Health requires that all livestock exhibited at County Fairs be tagged, tattooed or banded before entering barns.

Animals without ID's cannot be exhibited.

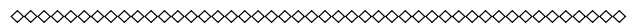

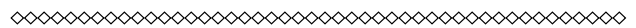

- All poultry except waterfowl and pigeons must be negative to the rapid whole-blood plate test for pullorum and typhoid diseases applied within 90 days prior the opening date of exhibition, provided that no test shall be required on poultry originating directly from the parent stock tested and found negative with the preceding 12 months.
- Testing for typhoid and pullorum will be done for a nominal fee, but must be arranged in advance by calling the superintendent at least 4 weeks before the fair. For birds hatched in current year, no testing is required if you get a CERTIFICATE OF ORIGIN from your hatchery (which they will provide if you request it). If you have any questions, please call the superintendent at least 3 weeks in advance of the fair.

Entry times:

- Wednesday from noon – 8:00 pm
- Thursday from 9am – noon
